

Our Story So Far.

1963-64

The Rouse Company acquires 14,000 acres in Howard County, MD to build a city. They recruit nationally known experts, known collectively as “The Work Group,” to outline the city’s development based on 4 main goals:

- Build a complete, diverse city that meets all basic needs (housing, jobs, recreation, education, culture)
- Respect the land with a strong infusion of nature
- Provide for the growth of people
- Make a profit



1967

Columbia’s first baby is born to Charles and Barbara Russell, an interracial couple, symbolizing Columbia’s values of a community that embraces progress and racial harmony.

2010

Adoption of Downtown Columbia plan unanimously adopted by Howard County council providing up to 14 MSF of net new density.

2015-17

The Metropolitan and Ten.M.Flats, deliver adjacent to The Mall in Columbia adding Howard Hughes’ first 817 apartments with 42,000 SF of retail across three buildings.

2020-22

Howard Hughes continues development of the Merriweather District with the delivery of Juniper (382 apartments with 56,000 SF of retail), Marlow (472 apartments with 32,000 SF of retail) and standalone retailer Bus Boys and Poets.

2025

Howard Hughes has over 4 MSF of commercial density and over 4,000 apartments remaining to join the existing 3 MSF of operating commercial property, 1,700 apartments, 200,000 SF of retail, and trails and parks.

1966

Construction begins! Renowned architect Frank Gehry is hired to build several buildings, including an exhibit center, Merriweather Post Pavilion, Rouse Company Headquarters, and a fire station.



1970-90

Rouse builds out 9 neighborhoods or “villages” founded on community with housing and neighborhood amenities. These villages surround Downtown Columbia, which Rouse always envisioned to be the vibrant urban core.

2014

Frank Gehry’s Rouse Co. HQ building is adaptively re-used into a Whole Foods, signaling progress in adhering to the city’s original goals. Merriweather Row is acquired, adding nearly 1 MSF of existing office product.



2016-19

The 1st buildings in the Merriweather District deliver including a complete renovation of Merriweather Post Pavilion, Inner Arbor (a wooded, curated art space celebrating nature), One Merriweather, Two Merriweather and 6100, trophy class mixed-use office buildings.

2023

Construction begins on 10285 Lakefront (Columbia’s 1st medical building), Lakefront North (a brand-new luxury residential neighborhood) is approved by Howard County and the new Lakefront library designed by Thomas Heatherwick is introduced.



2024

Direct access exit from route 29 delivered. Bark Social to open in the Merriweather District.






